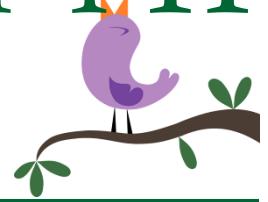

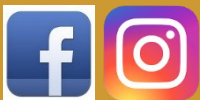

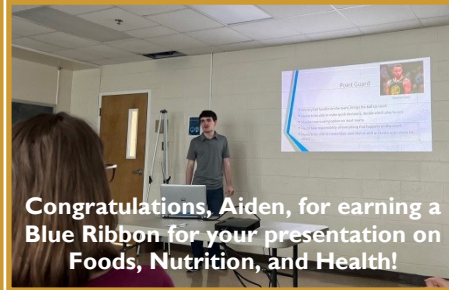

She will arrive at Dulles International Airport and participate in orientation and be ready to stay with a family on June 19th. She is scheduled to travel to Virginia Tech for the Virginia 4-H Congress June 26-30. Prince William 4-H families are needed to host the delegate for 1-2-3 weeks at a time.

About the Delegate: Jasmin is a 19 year-old from Austria and asked to come to Virginia so she could improve her English language skills and learn more about the state. She is fluent in German and pretty good in English. As a college student studying mechatronics (electrical, informatics and mechanical applications), Jasmin is interested in learning about technical connections and more about farming and cooking. HOSTING PERIOD: 3 1/2 weeks from late July to mid August

- You can host a youth aged 12-18 or an adult chaperone
- Youth have a range of English language abilities, so host families should be prepared to communicate imaginatively

HOST FAMILY REQUIREMENTS

- You must have a child of the same gender who is within 3 years of the hosted youth (children aged 9+ are eligible to host)
- Families without children of the appropriate age may host an adult chaperone
- No special activities need to be planned since these youth want to experience American culture, make new friends, and improve their English by staying with your family
- You don't need to be involved with 4-H to host

Parents Don't Let Your Babies Grow up to be Racists

Dr. Kim Allen, NC State University and Fiona Allen

We all want to raise our children to be caring, compassionate, informed, and kind people. When it comes to race, we sometimes struggle with what we should say and do, even though most of us agree that in order to raise our children to be kind, we need to address the difficult topic of racism. Helping our children become anti-racists requires more than conversations; it is about modeling desired behaviors, pointing out disparities, and consciously acting in ways that fight against white supremacy.

In this session, a mother and daughter presenting duo, Kim and Fiona Allen, will identify strategies for helping parents help children understand privilege, marginalization, and the systems that uphold racism. These strategies include helping children understand the history of racism in the US, how to talk about bias, and how to engage in social justice. We will also discuss what worked and didn't work in our house from the perspectives of a parent and a child.

Embracing Race: Helping Young Children Build a Positive Racial and Ethnic Identity
