Background

- ❑ December 16 – Board approved initial list of federal economic stimulus projects
- ❑ February 10 – Governor Kaine launched Stimulus.Virginia.gov as centralized location for potential Virginia projects that may benefit from federal stimulus funds
- ❑ February 17 – American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009 signed into law
- ❑ February 17 – Administration started Recovery.gov website
- ❑ March 17 – Board approved supplemental economic stimulus projects
- ❑ March 17 – County launched stimulus webpage www.pwcgov.org/recovery



Community Benefits

- Approximately \$122 million directed to local programs
- Amounts do not account for benefits made directly to individuals:
 - ◆ Tax incentives
 - ◆ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (formerly Food Stamps)
- K-12 and Higher Education:
 - ◆ State Fiscal Stabilization (two year total) \$49.1 million
 - ◆ Title I Grants (economically disadvantaged) \$5.2 million
 - ◆ IDEA School Age Part B (special education) \$14.6 million
 - ◆ IDEA Preschool Part B (special education) \$0.5 million
 - ◆ Educational Technology \$143,724
 - ◆ George Mason University \$10.9 million



Community Benefits (cont.)

□ Economic Development and Transportation:

◆ Potomac/Rappahannock Transportation Comm.	\$3.9 million
◆ Virginia Railway Express	\$9.8 million
◆ Prince William County (through NVTA)	\$8 million (est.)
◆ VDOT Road Maintenance	\$5.7 million
◆ USMC Heritage Trail	\$500,000
◆ Town of Haymarket Bus Trolley	\$145,000

□ Energy and Environmental:

◆ Public Works – Energy Efficiency & Conservation	\$3,226,400
◆ Prince William Forest Park	\$5.5 million
◆ Manassas National Battlefield	\$211,000

□ Public Safety:

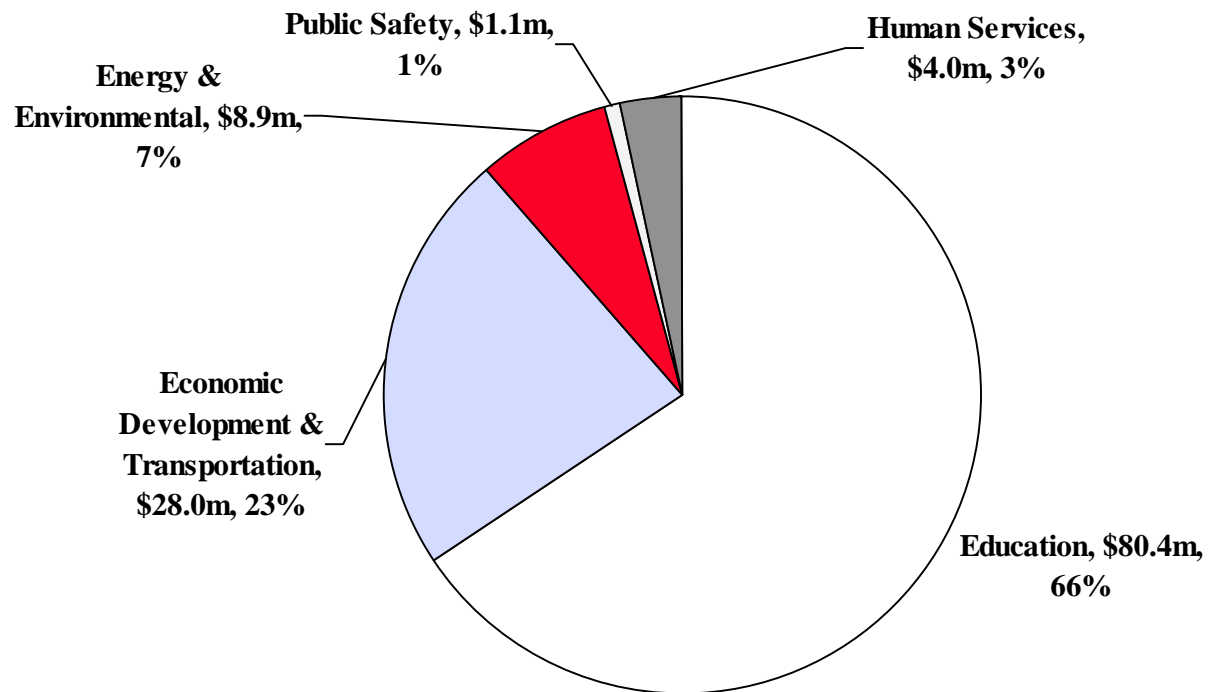
◆ Public Safety – Bureau of Justice Assistance	\$528,399
◆ Sheriff’s Office – FY 10 State Budget	\$88,694
◆ Adult Detention Center – FY 10 State Budget	\$528,361

□ Human Services:

◆ OHCD – Homeless Prevention	\$789,775
◆ OHCD – CDBG	\$516,528
◆ Aging – Senior Nutrition	\$30,113
◆ Greater Prince William Community Health Center	\$1.45 million
◆ Northern Virginia Workforce Investment Board	\$1.2 million



Community Benefits (cont.)



Pending Grant Applications

- COPS Hiring Recovery Program \$ 5.2 million
 - ◆ \$1 billion appropriated through ARRA
 - ◆ Received 7,272 applications totaling \$8.3 billion
 - ◆ Department of Justice aiming to award grants by September 30

- Fire Station Construction Grant \$ 5.0 million
 - ◆ \$210 million appropriated through ARRA
 - ◆ County requesting funds for Bacon Race Fire Station
 - ◆ Grant applications due July 10, 2009



Future Grant Applications

- Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery Discretionary Grants Program (TIGER)
 - ◆ \$1.5 billion program in ARRA
 - ◆ Administered by Federal Highway Administration
 - ◆ Route 1 North
 - ◆ Route 28 South
 - ◆ Due September 19th, 2009



Information on Tax Credits

- Internal Revenue Service administers some federal ARRA tax credits for individuals and businesses:
 - ◆ First-Time Homebuyer
 - ◆ Money Back for New Vehicle
 - ◆ Increased Transportation Subsidy
 - ◆ Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy
