VOLUNTEER DESCRIPTIONS

Barn Managers: adults who are organized, flexible, comfortable with facilitating others, and can communicate. We need 2 adult barn managers per shift.

Barn Volunteers: adults and youth that are willing to communicate with the public, lead other youth in

STEAM, health, community service and agriculture enrichment activities. We need 10 volunteers per shift.

EVENT DETAILS

Visitors to the Children's Barn will greeted by the Barn Manager and invited to walk through and choose one or all three 'Grab and Go Kits.' Additional volunteers will be on hand to answer any questions about the kits as well as direct visitors to the Ag Barn where they may put their kits together if they would like. Unlike previous years, this year we will not be leading activities in the Children's Barn.

Over in the Ag Barn volunteers are needed to assist youth and families with their Grab and Go Kits as well as help direct the community service activities; assist with the baby chicks and, possibly, rabbits; sell head wreaths; share their 4-H stories.
