

Possible Spotted Lanternfly Adult Look-alikes in Virginia

The adult spotted lanternfly, *Lycorma delicatula* (White), has a very distinctive appearance with black spots and bars on the upper wings and red, black, and white on the hindwings. Adults measure about 1" long and 0.5" wide. A few other insects in Virginia have similar color patterns, but a close look will show that spotted lanternfly is easily recognizable. Sizes not to scale.
